



From Pencils to Pigments: Portrait Drawing with Lauren Bass Mondays, 9:30am-12:30pm, January 8 - March 11, 8 weeks, \$265M/\$305NM

Embark on an exploration of creating a portrait with artist and educator, Lauren Bass. Portraiture, a time honored tradition, is commonly regarded as being exact and difficult. However, over the course of this 8-week class Lauren will breakdown the process into simple steps and tricks that make rending the head easier and help achieve likeness. Students will enjoy gaining a solid foundation in understanding the structure and solidity of the human head. They will learn essential principles such as proportion, perspective, light logic and color theory. Also discussed will be gesture, composition, edge quality, planar division of the head, comparative measuring, the anatomy of the features and more. This class starts with drawing, progresses to monochromatic painting (grisaille), and culminates in the vibrant world of full-color painting. From week to week we will build our knowledge base. Clear instruction will be given weekly through demonstrations, lectures and handouts. Students can progress at their own pace and will receive individual critiques appropriate to their level.

About the Instructor: Lauren Bass

I have been an artist my entire life, but my path as an artist hasn't been linear. Whether doodling in the margins of notebooks or sketching at home, I was always drawing as a child. However, the high school I went to didn't offer art so I had no formal training until college. There I took my first painting class and was hooked. I would observe a still life setup, mixed colors, replicate the abstract shapes and then step a few paces back. Incredibly, there was the image on my canvas. It felt like magic! I found that time stood still when I was painting I was

so absorbed! After getting a BA in Humanities, I got a BFA in graphic design and worked in advertising for several years. I put my career on hold when I had children but continued taking painting classes. As my children got older and more independent, I was able to be more serious, paint more frequently and study with many fabulous artists whose work I admired. I sought out some of the best artists in the country that work in my area of interest to study with. Luckily, many live locally.



Beginner and Intermediate Watercolor with Mary Callahan Mondays, January 22 - February 26, 6 weeks, 1-4pm, \$195M/\$235NM

This 6-week class is designed for the beginner and intermediate watercolorist, this course will first provide the fundamentals and then explore the many techniques of watercolor. Artworks may be based on still life setups, photos or your imagination. Emphasis will be on color and design with the goal of creating an original emotional statement.

Mary Callahan is a Copley Master in the Copley Society of Art, an Honorary Lifetime Member of the New England Watercolor Society and is a member of many other fine art organizations in Massachusetts and New York.

Watercolor Simplified with Jack Haran

Learn to create dynamic and visually engaging landscapes by mastering composition principles through limited palette oil painting. Students will learn to understand how the limited palette can be used to guide the viewer's eye and emphasize focal points within the painting. Ann will supply various landscape references for students. Every two weeks, the palette will change and students will learn how to work with the new set of limited colors to create dynamic landscapes. The class will challenge how we see color and encourages intentional and expressive brushwork, allowing you to convey the essence of the landscape with greater precision.



About the Instructor: Ann Musto

Ann has been a plein air and studio oil painter for over twenty years. Her interest lies in working to capture the beauty of what we see in light and color. We'll explore the craft techniques that contribute to propulsive scenes, like using dialogue to build tension and "thinking in pictures," and we'll read and discuss great scenes by terrific authors like Jesmyn Ward, Rumaan Alam, and Emily St. John Mandel. Writers of all experience levels will come away with a better grasp on how to build atmosphere, sustain tension, and contribute to their story's greater purpose in every scene they produce.

Starting Fresh – Making Your Oil Landscapes Stronger by Design with Tony Andrade

Fridays, January 12 - February 16, 10am-1pm, 6 weeks, \$195M/\$235NM

This course will emphasize composition and planning of landscape oil painting, placing a greater emphasis on initial development through a simple sketch followed by a small drawing. This approach focuses on identifying the key elements and establishing the overall structure before applying brush to canvas. Many painters tend to rush this phase, missing out on crucial pre-painting planning that ultimately leads to stronger results. The class will closely analyze their chosen reference materials, whether they be photos or other sources. This critical examination will help us identify areas for improvement, ensuring that their paintings possess a clarity that captivates the audience in the most impactful way possible.

About the Instructor: Tony Andrade



I make images with paint, paper, canvas and cameras. I enjoy non-representational approaches as well as realist work. I began my career as an illustrator then switched to graphic design, and started my own studio in the late 70s. The majority of my career I worked with clients as an art director & designer. In working with many photographers and freelance illustrators creating annual reports, brochures and many various allied pieces. I became intrigued with the art-making process • I began making art and photography for relaxation in the mid 80s. I try to find inspiration

whenever and wherever life occurs. It can inspire you in the most profound ways. My art evolves constantly from intricately detailed watercolors to light and bright abstractions, to special effects digital works in photography. When I start a new piece I want it to take me to new places, it's what I find so appealing in making my art.

Laurinda and Liz will introduce you to pastels, papers, markmaking and creating pastel paintings on different types of paper. All materials will be provided so students can enjoy the freedom of experimenting with pastels

without the commitment.





About the Instructors: Liz Haywood-Sullivan and Laurinda O'Connor

Liz Haywood-Sullivan has been dedicated to working exclusively in the pastel medium since 1996. Her attraction to the medium is pastel's unique ability to capture light and atmosphere in the landscape. She is a sought-after instructor and judge for pastel societies and arts organizations around the world. Liz authored

the popular book Painting Brilliant Skies and Water in Pastel (Northlight, 2013). Her award-winning pastel paintings have been featured in numerous books and magazine articles, and have appeared in national, international and museum exhibitions worldwide. Liz is a President Emerita of the International Association of Pastel Societies (2013-2017) and is the current president of the North River Arts Society.

Laurinda is an award winning artist and instructor, teaching a master class, adult pastel classes, workshops, and giving demonstrations



throughout the country. She also teaches art to grades K- 8. She has been a juror of selection and awards for several national and member shows. She has been featured in the Pastel Journal magazine. Laurinda is a Signature Member with the Pastel Society of America and the Pastel Painters Society of Cape Cod. She is a gallery artist at The Copley Society in Boston and at South Shore Art Center, and is represented in several other New England galleries. She has had several solo and group exhibits and shows in various national and members shows in the northeast. She is also a board member, serves as chair, and is on several art societies' committees.

In this hands-on class, you will learn the basics of knitting, including essential techniques such as casting on, knit and purl stitches, increasing and decreasing, and binding off. Our experienced instructor will guide you through each step, ensuring you gain confidence and proficiency in this timeless craft. Students can choose to make a knit hat or scarf with guidance from the instructor.



About the Instructor: Kristen Evan

Kristen Evan moved to Marshfield in 2019, after living in Needham, MA, for 20 years, and fell in love with the community. Introduction to Water Soluble Oil Paints with Joan Appel 1-Day Workshop, January 20, 9am-4pm, \$175M/\$215NM

Water soluble oil paints act and look the same as traditional oils. They are used without solvents, and clean up with soap and water. In the workshop I will demonstrate different techniques including wet into wet, glazing, impasto. This is a workshop for people who are already familiar with using traditional oils or acrylics and who would like to explore the use of more ecologically friendly materials for creating art. Participants are encouraged to experiment.



About the Instructor: Joan Appel

Museum of Fine Arts, Boston, DeCordova Museum, Paier College of Art and Lesley University. At Lesley she earned a Master's degree in Arts Administration. This enabled her to be hired as Development Manager at the South Shore Art Center in Cohasset, MA, and to later become Acting Director there.

Oil painting and monotype printmaking are her primary forms of artistic expression. Among other prizes, her art won Best in Show at the Cape Cod Art Center and the Cape Cod Museum of Art. Story-telling and commentary on

ecological issues are evident in much of her work, sometimes stated with wry humor, often in mixed media. Her monotypes are created without a press in her Marshfield MA studio. These abstract pieces have been included in such international exhibits as at the University of Massachusetts, Amherst and the Newport, RI Museum of Art.

Best Practices Series: Supporting a Life in the Arts
